Auditory learners learn best by hearing information. They can usually remember information more accurately when it is explained to them orally.

Check The Characteristics That Apply

- Enjoys public speaking and/or performance
- Reads slowly
- Responds to verbal cues
- Appreciates words and is good at foreign language
- Talks out loud when working on a math problem
- Is good at foreign language
- Prefers listening to an audio CD instead of reading the same material
- Memorizes names and numbers by saying them
- Prefers oral instructions
- Reads out loud or whispers the words when reading, especially when overly tired
- Has difficulty being quiet, will talk aloud to the TV, computer, self, etc
- Has a well-developed vocabulary
- Enjoys talking on the phone
- Prefers someone else reads steps out loud when assembling things
- Prefers to communicate ideas verbally
- Can remember what was said word for word
- Follows spoken directions well

Each child is unique, so not all the characteristics fit every child. Plus, environmental factors may have altered some natural behaviors.
