Visual learners association information and concepts with techniques or pictures. They prefer the big picture and not the details.

Check the Characteristics That Apply

- Focuses on the end result and may miss steps on how to get to the end
- Has a good sense of spatial perception and can easily visualize objects
- Assembles things correctly using written directions
- Likes to read
- Has poor punctuation when writing, but good ideas
- Understands and likes charts
- Does not remember concepts by practicing
- Has an “ah hah moment” when a visualization of the idea “snaps”
- Gets lost in the details
- Needs to know what the overall objective is – “the big picture”
- Likes fashion
- Prefers written instructions
- Needs to write things down to remember
- Writes notes constantly and has scraps of paper everywhere because of them
- Has a good sense of direction
- Has a vivid imagination
- Is good at identifying patterns

Each child is unique, so not all the characteristics fit every child. Plus, environmental conditions may have altered some natural behaviors. However, if your child exhibits a majority of these traits, then he or she will benefit from learning toys for visual learners.
